1. Réponse : B

The text mentions 50 million Australian dollars, not US dollars. All other statements are accurate according to the article.

2. Réponse : B

The law requires social media platforms to take "reasonable steps" to prevent minors under 16 from creating accounts.

3. Réponse : B

Digital rights groups argue that age verification could compromise privacy and push young people towards less regulated platforms.

4. Réponse : C

The article describes Dr. Helen Ward as "a child psychologist at the University of Melbourne" who supports the legislation.

5. Réponse : C

"This" refers to the legislation/move to ban under-16s from social media. The PM says "This is about keeping our kids safe."

6. Réponse : B

"Even though" expresses contrast: I missed the bus despite having set my alarm.

7. Réponse : C

"Their" is the possessive adjective needed before a noun (assignments).

8. Réponse : B

After "good at", a gerund (-ing form) is required. Both blanks need gerunds: giving / speaking.

9. Réponse : C

The correct structure is "as + adjective + as" for equal comparisons.

10. Réponse : B

"Pleasing" should be "pleased". We use the past participle (-ed) to describe how someone feels.

11. Réponse : A

"Turn down" means to reduce the volume. "Turn up" means increase, "turn off" means switch off.

12. Réponse : A

"Put off" means to postpone or delay something.

13. Réponse : B

"Eco-friendly" means not harmful to the environment. "Perishable" and "disposable" are unrelated to sustainability.

14. Réponse : C

Pottery is a craft/art form, not a sport. Cricket, rugby and fencing are all sports.

15. Réponse : B

"Launch" means to introduce or release something new, especially a product.

16. Réponse : A

A crowded city street with people wearing face masks best represents urban life during a health crisis.

17. Réponse : C

The standard time difference between London (GMT) and Sydney (AEDT) is approximately 11 hours.

18. Réponse : B

The bald eagle is the national symbol of the United States of America.

19. Réponse : C

Natural gas is a fossil fuel, not a renewable energy source.

20. Réponse : B

Donald Trump won the US presidential election in November 2024.

21. Réponse : C

"There" indicates a place. "They're" = they are, "their" = possessive adjective.

22. Réponse : A

"Goverment" is misspelled. The correct spelling is "government".

23. Réponse : B

"Pair" means two of something. "Pear" is a fruit, "pare" means to peel, "pier" is a dock.

24. Réponse : B

"Postponed" is the correct spelling of the past participle.

25. Réponse : A

"There's" (there is) is correct to express existence. "Their's" doesn't exist.

26. Réponse : B

3/4 is said "three quarters" in English.

27. Réponse : B

$800,000 \div 4 = 200,000$ = two hundred thousand. "Thousand" is invariable after a number.

28. Réponse : B

The \$ symbol indicates dollars. \$25.99 is read "twenty-five dollars ninety-nine".

29. Réponse : C

2001 is said "two thousand and one".

30. Réponse : C

In English, decimals use "point" and each digit is read separately: "five point seven five".

31. Réponse : A

Past continuous + past simple for an interrupted action: "were you doing / went".

32. Réponse : C

Future perfect (will have + past participle) for an action completed before another future event.

33. Réponse : B

After "as soon as", use present simple (not future) even for future meaning.

34. Réponse : C

Present perfect continuous (have been studying) explains the current result (being tired) of a recent prolonged action.

35. Réponse : D

Present perfect (has lived) with "since" for an action that started in the past and continues to the present.

36. Réponse : A

"I have never been to" is the correct present perfect structure with "never" for life experience.

37. Réponse : B

"Should" is followed by the base form of the verb (pay), no "to" needed.

38. Réponse : C

Present perfect continuous + "for" (duration) is correct. "Since" is used with a point in time, not a duration.

39. Réponse : C

"Last year" requires the past simple (decided), not the present perfect. "Move to" (not "in") the countryside.

40. Réponse : B

Present perfect continuous + "since" for an ongoing action. "I don't have an umbrella" is the correct negative form.
