Social media ban for under-16s passes into law in Australia

Australia has become the first country in the world to ban children under 16 from using social media, after the Senate passed the landmark legislation on Thursday.

The new law will require social media platforms such as TikTok, Instagram, Facebook and Snapchat to take "reasonable steps" to prevent minors from creating accounts. Companies that fail to comply could face fines of up to 50 million Australian dollars (approximately £25 million).

Prime Minister Anthony Albanese described the move as a "groundbreaking" step to protect young Australians. "This is about keeping our kids safe," he told reporters. "We know social media is causing real harm to our children, and as a government, we have a responsibility to act."

Critics of the ban, however, have raised concerns about its practicality. Digital rights groups argue that age verification systems could compromise user privacy and may push young people towards less regulated corners of the internet.

According to a 2024 report by the Australian eSafety Commissioner, 75% of children aged 8 to 12 were already active on at least one social media platform, despite existing age restrictions. Among teenagers aged 13 to 17, the figure rose to 95%.

Mental health experts have broadly welcomed the legislation. Dr. Helen Ward, a child psychologist at the University of Melbourne, said: "The evidence linking heavy social media use to anxiety, depression and poor sleep in young people is overwhelming. This law sends a powerful message."

The legislation will come into effect within 12 months, giving tech companies time to develop and implement age verification technology.
