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TEXTE 1

Giddy guides

THEY started off with mushrooms—and ended up with a start-up that could change the way people discover new cities and even their own home town. That, in a nutshell, is the story of Gidsy, a website based in Berlin that connects travellers with locals who offer offbeat tours, events and workshops.

The extended version of Gidsy's creation story goes something like this: in 2010 Edial and Floris Dekker, brothers and web designers, moved from Amsterdam to Berlin to start an internet firm. What kind, they didn't know. But they are also passionate cooks, and they wanted to collect mushrooms for a risotto. To avoid ending up poisoned, they searched online for a local guide offering a mushroom-picking tour. "We didn't find a single offer. This is when we realised: this is a business opportunity", recalls Edial Dekker.

About a year later Gidsy was launched. Like most start-ups, Gidsy is tight-lipped about how it is doing. Mr Dekker claims that the number of event organizers has grown by 50% in the past two months. At any rate, the firm has attracted prominent investors who have funded the venture to the tune of \$1.2m. They include Hollywood star Ashton Kutcher, Werner Vogels, Amazon's chief technology officer, and venture-capital firms Index Ventures and Sunstone Capital.

Gidsy applies the idea of peer-to-peer (p2p)—a direct exchange between people—to a category which can be loosely defined as "interesting things to do". These range from a street-art graffiti tour in Lisbon to a traditional Italian cooking class in Rome and from collecting bottles in Berlin (pictured) to an eco expedition in New York's Central Park. Organizers determine how many people can sign up and what they will have to pay. Gidsy handles registration and payments, and ensures that all involved are safe and happy.

Guides, for instance, do not have to worry about unreliable pub crawlers who do not show up: bookings have to be cancelled at least two days prior to an event. Organizers get their money only 24 hours after an event: if it goes terribly wrong, payments can be refunded. And, as with other p2p services, participants can comment on events and rate them online.

TEXTE 2

A sudden change of tide: The people who quit their day job to sail the world

Hail stones the size of fists pummel the small sailboat lurching violently in the Pacific Ocean. Blanketed in darkness, Nik Brbora desperately tries to steer his 18-strong crew through 50-knot hurricane winds and waves three-storeys high. As dawn approaches, a monster wave flips the yacht, ripping out the steering and smashing Brbora against the deck. Falling in and out of consciousness, the 29-year-old is rescued by U.S. coast guards who take him to the closest hospital -- 900 kilometers away in San Francisco. It's a terrifying and ultimately death-defying moment for the IT engineer from London. Yet now, as he looks back three months after completing the year-long Clipper Round the World Yacht Race, Brbora says the journey was also the greatest experience of his life.

It may seem like the sort of grand adventure only the most hardened sailor would be capable of. But in an unusual twist, the majority of people on board have never sailed a boat in their lives. Australian Lisa Blair, who also completed the full circumnavigation on a different yacht, raised part of the money for her trip through a sponsored 1,300 kilometer cycle ride from Sydney to the Sunshine Coast.

After being selected from almost 800 applicants, the 27-year-old novice sailor quit her retail assistant job, packed up her house and moved to Britain for an intensive sailing course. Within months she was bunking down with 17 other strangers in a clipper headed for the first stop -- Rio de Janeiro in Brazil. With limited access to phones and internet, the crew is essentially cut off from the outside world.

Throughout last year's race, participants ranged from 18 to 73-years-old, hailing from 40 countries across the world. They included a NASA scientist, ballet teacher, TV weather girl, farmer, undertaker and London cabbie driver.

The clipper race was a life-changing adventure for both Blair and Brbora. After all, why stress about a late train or rainy weather when you've survived the most brutal waves on the planet? «Not many people can say they've sailed around the world," Brbora said. "It's made me realize you shouldn't be afraid of things and it's definitely given me more confidence."

"I've started living my life by the quote: 'Just do, because the world is changed by doers,'" Blair said. "You're not going to change the world by sitting on the couch watching TV."
